Digitalia has two CC offers:

<u>Digitalia Hispanica</u> is a Spanish language collection of over 40,000 ebooks and ejournals published in Spain and Latin America. This deal includes MARC records, no simultaneous user limits, unlimited downloads (with DRM), and monthly content additions.

<u>Digitalia Film Library</u> is a multi-lingual, multinational collection of streaming films. This offer includes public performance rights and MARC records.

The CC's collective cost avoidance for 2020 was \$421 million, which sets a new record and is 5% higher than our 2018 total.

# **Upcoming Renewals and Expirations**

Our EBSCO Academic ebook subscriptions end June 30<sup>th</sup>. We have 39 subscribers to the <u>large interdisciplinary package</u> of 210,000 titles. And we have another 26 subscriptions to subject collections like Business, Religion, Engineering, History, Education, University Presses, Nursing, Clinical, and Community Colleges. For some of the subject collections, we have added new subscribers and are thus eligible for an increased discount. None of these ebook packages include any ownership; they are annual leases. But the price per title is **extremely** low.

Current subscribers should make their renew/cancel decision by the end of April, if possible. EBSCO is happy to send early invoices to any subscriber that needs one.

Free 30 day trials are available to schools interested in potentially joining this deal, with a start date of July 1, 2021.
