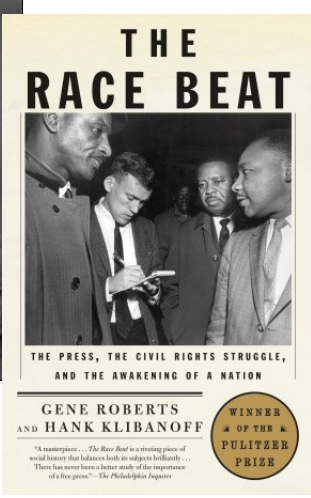
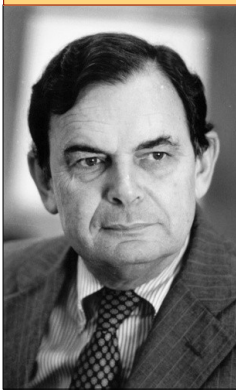


Friends of the UNCG Libraries Annual Dinner



Gene Roberts is a journalism professor at the University of Maryland, College Park. He joined the *New York Times* in 1965, where until 1972 he served as chief southern and civil rights correspondent, chief war correspondent in South Vietnam, and national editor. During his eighteen years as executive editor of the *Philadelphia Inquirer*, the paper won seventeen Pulitzer Prizes. He later became the managing editor of *The New York Times*. He has covered some of the most important events of the 20th century: the assassination of President Kennedy, the Civil Rights Movement, and the Vietnam War. He holds two honorary doctorates and has received several national journalism awards for lifetime achievement. A native of Goldsboro, he now lives in New York City.
