

## **Using Google Scholar Tutorial Part 1: Customizing**

Google Scholar Part One:

I know we all like to use Google to search, but when you are doing scholarly research, you are going to get a lot of results and a lot of them are not going to be very relevant. If you try Google Scholar you will get a lot more scholarly results from peer-reviewed journal articles, theses, and even books. Why Google Scholar? Google Scholar searches scholarly only publications where regular Google searches anything on the internet. Google Scholar also ranks relevancy by author and publishers rather than my popularity of the site.

Now we want to customize our Google scholar so it links to the UNCG library databases that we pay for and subscribe to already. Otherwise you might find articles and not find the actual full text.

So the way to do this is click on Settings at <http://scholar.google.com/> Click on Library Links located on left. Here type "University of North Carolina at Greensboro" or UNCG and click on Find Library. Check next to the box for UNCG and click save. Should take you back to the home page and now you are ready to use Google Scholar.

Now let's take a look at some search results. Now that we have linked to UNCG, next to some of these results you see Find Full Text at UNCG link If you click on this you can find out if we have the full text available from one of our subscriptions

Clicking on the title of one of your results, may give you access to a possible free online article but often times when you click on the title, you get a page like this that says you cant get the full article unless you pay. That's why customizing and clicking on the UNCG link, will guide you to get free access since we subscribe and pay for this through the university libraries.

If we don't have full text of the article you want, you can use our Interlibrary Services for free to get a copy from another library.
